MARCH MADNESS

How Many Assists Did You Have?

I can still here my basketball coach saying "Take your ball with you when you go home and dribble the whole way. You'll never get better if you don't practice, practice, practice . . . and don't just use your right hand either."

Challenging myself to grow in weak areas wasn't the only lesson I took away from the early basketball years.

Here's another: Seems like you mainly hear about the players who scored the most points. When's the last time you heard a celebration for the player with the most assists? You know, those guys who pass and tip and set up the plays?

Learning to take satisfaction from an assist is a hard lesson in humility, but it's an important lesson - especially for leaders. To be the one behind the scenes—the one setting up the play and making the perfect pass for some else to score—well, it's not always our strong suit. But a good leader is a good teammate, building up others, strategically helping his/her teammates score, and being excited for them when they do.

A strong leader recognizes that the assist played an important role in the score, but needs no recognition for it.

Paul said "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God made it grow . . . the man who plants and waters have one purpose." *1 Cor. 3:6-9*

So go on . . .
